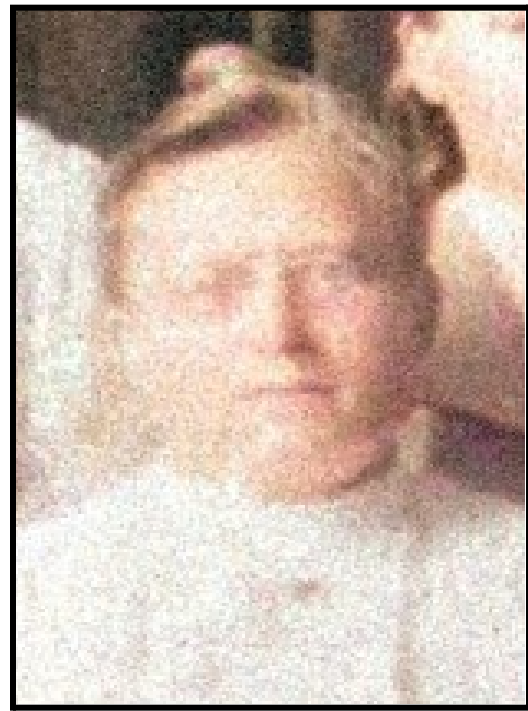


Mrs. Paul Korn, née Flora Winkler, was born in the city of Dresden, Germany, on January 18, 1857, and died on March 29, 1917, in Burlington, Wisconsin. She was confirmed in the famous Kreuzkirche in Dresden and received higher education, preparing her as a kindergarten teacher and governess. She served for a time as a governess in South America. On December 21, 1882, she married Pastor Paul Korn in the city of Dresden. Five years later, they came to America, where Mrs. Korn faithfully stood by her husband's side in his service in the church of Christ, first in the southern states and then in northern Wisconsin and upper Michigan, before he accepted the call from the community in Stades Corners, Wisconsin. The Lord blessed their marriage with four sons and two daughters, among whom two sons, Alex and Rudolf, entered the holy ministry. Alex died in 1931. After the death of her husband in 1902, Mrs. Korn spent most of her remaining years in the city of Burlington, Wisconsin, where, after a long illness, she peacefully passed away in the Lord at the advanced age of 80 years, 2 months, and 2 days.

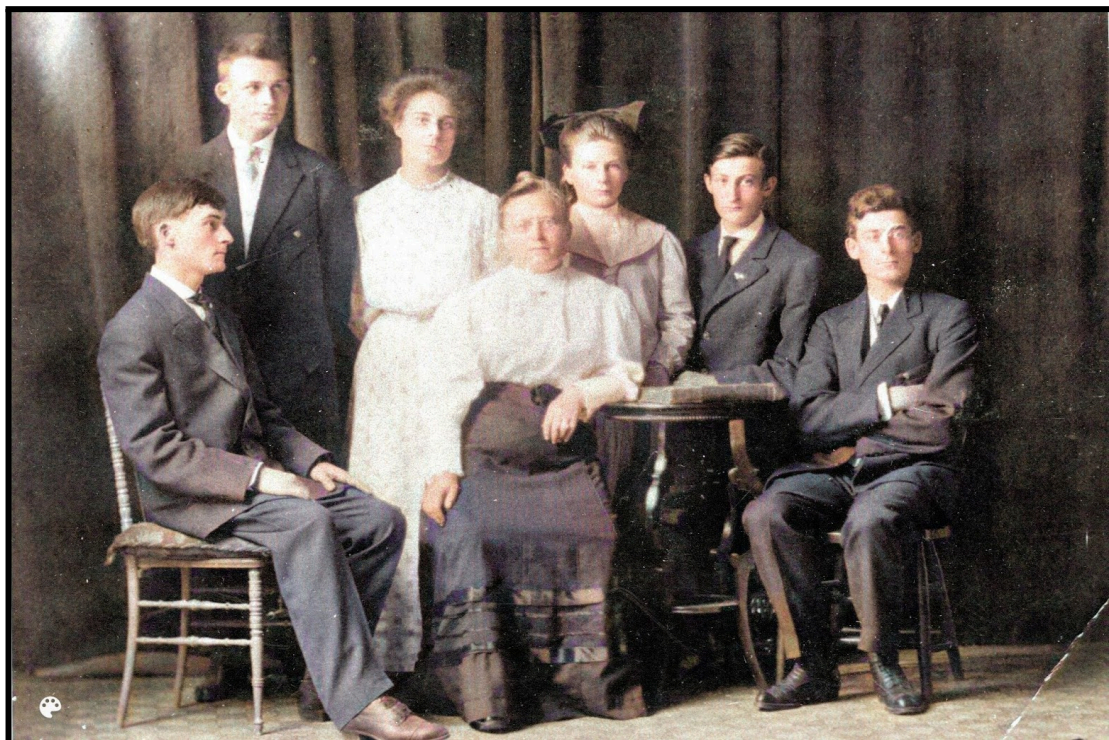
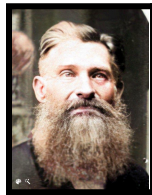


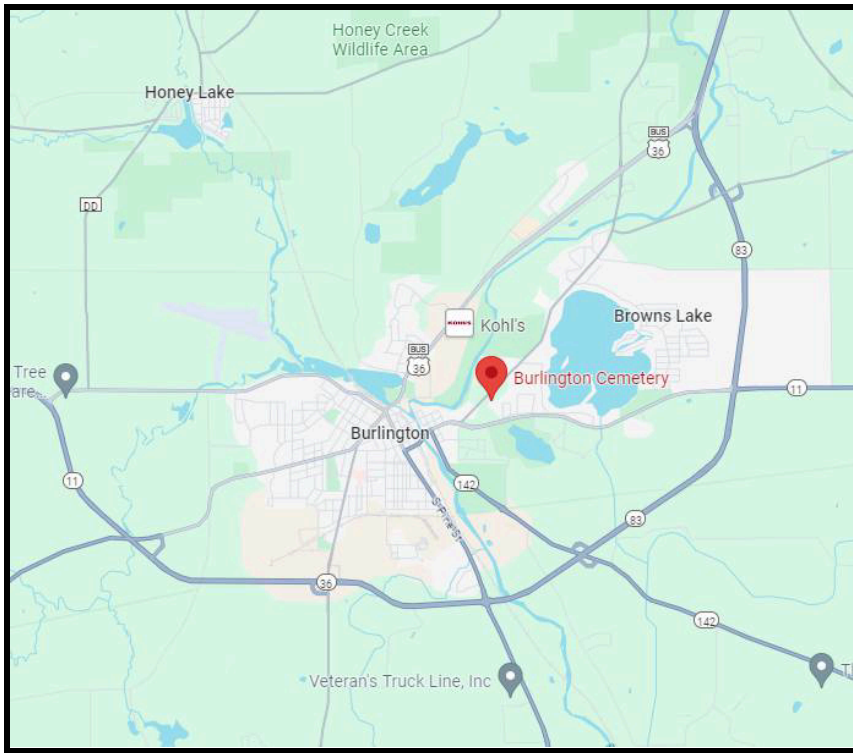
